УРОК АНГЛИЙСКОГО ЯЗЫКА ПО TEME ''SHOPPING''

IX класс

Урок разработан с использованием технологии «Развитие критического мышления через чтение и письмо».

Задачи урока:

- активизация лексических знаний;
- развитие умений чтения (с извлечением основной информации);
- формирование и развитие умений устной речи по теме (монологическая речь);
- развитие навыка письма.
- Оборудование: тексты для чтения (4 вида), записи на доске, бумага формата АЗ, А4.

Ход урока

І. Организационная часть.

Приветствие. Беседа о погоде. Сообщение темы урока: Today we are going to read and discuss the texts about shopping and prepare to write an essay on the topic.

II. Стадия «Вызов».

Teacher. We are going to talk about shopping. Look at the phrases, fill in the missing letters and make up a few sentences on the topic of our lesson.

It is interesting to find out your opinion about shopping. The next task for you is to make up a cinquain. I expect you already know what one is. If you do not know, use the rule. Shopping two adjectives three verbs a phrase a synonym

Example:
Shopping
exciting, tiring
to look for, to try on, to buy
shopping is fun
wasting money.

III. «Смысловая стадия»

Стратегия «Зигзаг»

На столе учителя находится четыре текста, распечатанных на разноцветных листах бумаги (каждый из 4-х текстов распечатан на листах определенного цвета). Учитель предлагает учащимся взять любой текст и объединиться в группы так, чтобы у одногруппников были все тексты (разного цвета). Так учащиеся объединяются в кооперативные группы.

Затем учащиеся снова объединяются в группы (экспертные) по следующему принципу: у всех в группе должен быть один и тот же текст *(см. Приложение)*.

Teacher: I have brought some texts today about shopping. They are of different colours. I'd like you to come to my table and take one of them.

Now we shall do some group work. Split up into groups of four. There should be all colours in each group. Take your new places, please and remember your group.

Split up into groups again. There should be one colour in each group. Take your new places, please. Now listen to what you have to do. Read the text very carefully and prepare to present the text in the different way. You can use a cluster or a table.

Now you should return to your first group and retell your text using your cluster or the table.

The next task is to make a big cluster or a big table using the information from all texts. You should try to show the connection with the main ideas of the texts.

Учащиеся читают текст в экспертных группах и составляют схему или кластер, после чего возвращаются в свои кооперативные группы и докладывают одногруппникам изученный материал по составленной схеме/таблице/кластеру. После этого они получают задание составить на листах формата А3 общий кластер, отражающий весь изученный на уроке материал.

IV. Стадия «Рефлексия».

Прием «Кластер»

- 1. Составление совместно с учителем общего кластера на доске.
- 2. Подготовка к написанию эссе на тему "Some people believe that shopping is a great pleasure while others are sure it is a big problem."

Teacher: Your time is up. Let's work together. What are we going to talk about?

Pupils: We are going to talk about shopping.

Teacher: When we begin to talk about shopping the first thing is buying. What is buying connected with?

Pupils: Buying is connected with choosing, ordering and picking up.

Teacher: The second is - ways of shopping. What ways of shopping have you read about?

Pupils: We have read about shopping by phone, online and in modern shopping centres.

Teacher: What do people think about shopping?

Pupils: For some people, shopping is a pleasant experience. Some people don't enjoy shopping.

Teacher: Where can we do shopping? *Pupils:* We can do shopping in modern shopping centres.

Teacher: Are shopping centres only for shops or something else? What can we find there?

Pupils: There is a children's play area, a food area, cinemas and cash machines.

Teacher: Shopping centres have different shops, don't they? What kinds of shops does Fletcher's have?

Pupils: It has a flower shop, a sports shop, a key booth, a photographer's and a charity shop. *Teacher:* So, we all have to shop and most of us like shopping. But some people think it is a problem. Why do they think so?

Pupils: Because they get addicted to shopping.

Teacher: Why do they get addicted?

Pupils: They have got childhood problems, feel unimportant.

Teacher: What can they do?

Pupils: They can find a new hobby, learn a new skill, help other people, rebuild their lives.

Teacher: We have been very active today and have done lots of work. Can we use this cluster? Can it help us to write an essay? Try to write an essay on this statement: "Some people believe that shopping is a great pleasure while others are sure it is a big problem."

What is your opinion? Write 200-250 words. Use the following plan:

- make an introduction (state the problem);
- express your personal opinion and reasons for it;
- give arguments for the other point of view and explain why you disagree with it;
- draw a conclusion.

Addicted to Shopping

It's not easy to get over shopping addiction. It seems that the best treatment involves finding the real reason behind the behavior, such as childhood memories or difficulties in your present life. Once you understand the cause, then you can deal with it differently. For example, if the shopping addiction comes from feeling unimportant, you need to find other ways of making yourself feel good, such as learning a new skill or helping other people in some way. Many shopping addicts manage to rebuild their lives, but it's not easy, and the shops are still just a short bus ride away.
